Bob Ferrone has found time in his retirement to get involved in finding out more about his past. He has been going through many of his family photos. He talked today was about finding pictures of his family, included pictures of his dad as he served in WWII during the liberation of Paris. He also told how his dad had fought in the Battle of the Bulge. After the war, his dad and mom married, had two children and lived in Queens and Brooklyn, NY. His dad was a pipe fitter until the shipyard where he worked was closed in 1965 by Robert McNamara. Their family moved to China Lake, California to continue his profession as a pipe fitter. It was that, or become a letter carrier in Juno, Alaska. This was very traumatic move because this was at the end of Bob's sophomore year of high school.
